A CHANNEL INTO THE HEART OF BOSTON THE BLUE WAY TRAM SYSTEM The Blue Way Arch re-imagines the Northern Avenue Bridge as a Boston icon and glass pods, the tram transports a link to both the city's industrial past and its innovative future. By creating an open waterway through the bridge's center, the arch embraces harbor and Boston the ocean's slice into downtown and stimulates a waterfront vibrancy celebrating Boston's rich maritime history. BLUE WAY Visitors and lifelong residents alike will converge at the Blue Way Parks for a ride on the tram, views of the harbor, channel-side museums, art installations, and recreational water activities.
